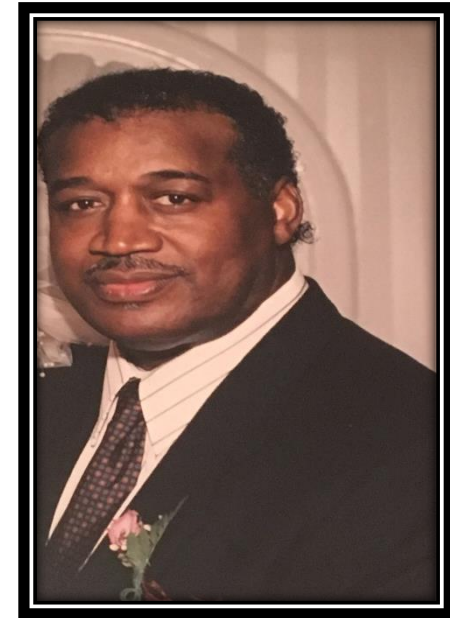
God looked around His garden and found an empty space,
