She was a graduate of Allen University and received a Master of Arts degree from Columbia University. She did additional studies at the University of Pennsylvania, Ball State University, and the University of South Carolina.

She was an instructor of English at Barber Scotia College, Concord, NC, Southern University, Baton Rouge, LA, South Carolina State College, Orangeburg, SC, Florida A&M University, Tallahassee, FL, and Allen University, Columbia, SC. After years of dedicated service, she retired in 1987.

Ms. Atkinson was a member of the American Association of University Professors, the National Council of English Teachers, Phi Delta Kappa, and Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.
