#### Obituary

*Mrs. Helen Crawford Tyler*, the daughter of the late Simeon and Kathleen Riley Crawford, was born October 16, 1930, in Denmark, South Carolina. She was the widow of the late Reverend Willie James Tyler. From this union, they were blessed with one child, Wiltress K. Tyler. Mrs. Tyler resided in Bamberg, South Carolina. She passed on to eternal rest on Wednesday, October 13, 2021, in Columbia, South Carolina, just three days before her 91st birthday.

At an early age, she joined the Rome Baptist Church, along with her sisters, who preceded her in death: Louise Richardson, Thelma Thomas, Anna Spears, Dorothea White, Marcell Lewis, and Ida Williams. After marriage, she became a member of the St. John Baptist Church, where she served faithfully with the Music Ministry, Deaconess Ministry, Missionary Ministry, and Vacation Bible School. She was an active attendant of Sunday School and Bible Study. She was also active with the Mount Calvary Sunday School and BTU Convention, the Mount Calvary Baptist Association, and the Lovely Hill Association, where her husband was an affiliate pastor. She always honored her relationship with Christ, even when she resided with her daughter in Columbia, by attending services at the Brookland Baptist Church, Northeast.

Mrs. Tyler matriculated through the Denmark School System to complete her secondary education. After graduating from high school, she attended Voorhees College for two years. Her community affiliations also included membership in the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) and the Eta Gamma Sigma Chapter of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, Incorporated.
