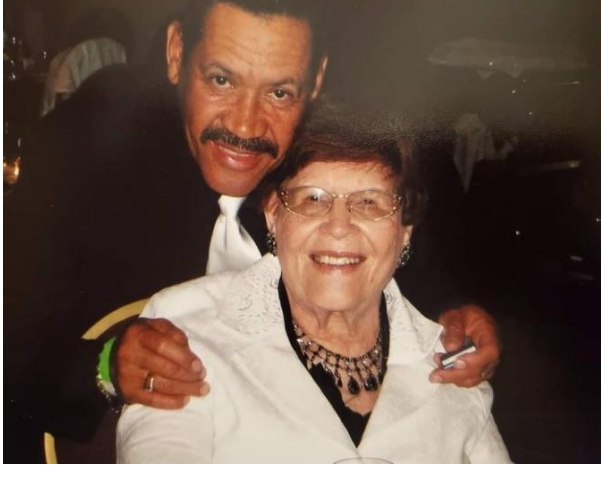

# The Obituary

## MRS. GAYNELL Bush Rogers Glenn

Mrs. Gaynell Bush Rogers Glenn, the daughter of the late John and Martha Mitchell Bush was born on October 15, 1926, in the Pontiac/Elgin community of Richland County, SC. She was the eighth of thirteen siblings whom all preceded her in death except for her younger sister Juanita and baby brother Norbert. In Psalm 90:10, it references “the days of our years are three score years and ten” however, Gaynell was blessed with 95 years of God’s grace and mercy.

Gaynell, the daughter of sharecroppers, worked tirelessly on the family farm and in the fields. She attended grade school at Jacob Mission, a country schoolhouse in Pontiac/Elgin and high school at Booker T. Washington High School in Columbia, SC. She continued her education and graduated with a diploma from Spring Valley Adult Education School, in Columbia, SC.

In 1950, she moved to a house on Gabriel Street in the Greenview Community in Columbia, SC. She was united in holy matrimony to Warren Rogers for twelve years and this union was blessed with five sons. She later married Willie Glenn and this union was blessed with two sons. Her house became a loving home where she raised her seven sons. Her love and devotion to her sons and her sons’ devotion to her was immeasurable. Her door was always open, and her children, family and friends visited her daily. If they couldn’t visit, they would call and check on her and you could count on Gaynell calling and checking on them as well.

Gaynell was the pillar and strength of the Bush and Mitchell family and could be found in attendance at the family gatherings and events. She was filled with love and supported her children, grandchildren, family, and friends.

She worked for and retired from the Department of Youth Services after 19 years of service. After retirement, she spent numerous years providing Elder Care in various capacities until the age of 80. She was a lifetime member of the Prince Hall Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star #342 where she provided committed service to the Order of Eastern Stars and to all humanity.

She accepted Christ as her personal Savior at a young age and was a faithful and dedicated member of Green Hill Baptist Church of Lugoff, SC which she called the “home church”. She unselfishly gave of her time by serving on the Missionary Society, Pulpit Aid Auxiliary and Sunday School. Due to life’s demands and the traveling distance to Lugoff, Gaynell was not always able to attend her home church on a regular basis but found solace in her neighborhood church “Greenview First Baptist Church” where she also became a member and attended when she could not attend her home church. Even during the COVID 19 pandemic, Gaynell would dial in and listen to bible study and watch church service on her tablet. She loved her church family and always welcomed their visitation and phone calls. Her love for God was incomparable and was recognized by all who knew her.

Early Sunday morning, surrounded by family, our beloved mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, cousin, and friend went from labor to rest. Precious memories will live forever in the hearts of her devoted and loving sons, Leroy “Rick” Rogers, Warren “Tim” Rogers, Jr. (Patricia), Bobby “Doody” Rogers (Lois), Jimmy Rogers, Willie “Kim” Glenn, Jr. (Carmen) and Michael “Mike” Glenn (Justine); seventeen grandchildren; thirty-eight great grandchildren; sister, Juanita Boykin-Boyd; brother, Norbert Bush; daughter-in-law, Karen Rogers; a special niece, Betty Boykin, whom she loved like a sister, and a host of great-great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.

On Sunday morning when Gaynell entered her heavenly home, hours later, God dispatched his angels around Gaynell’s granddaughter, Shannon Joi Rogers, to join her in their heavenly home where they will live forever with our Lord.
