She was born on February 15, 1943, to the late Hugh B. Lindsay and the late Christine Calhoun Briggs in Laurens, South Carolina. At the early age of eight, she moved to Brooklyn, New York, to live with her mother and stepfather, James Briggs.

Her Christian experience began at Cornerstone Baptist Church in Brooklyn, New York where she joined and was baptized.

Edith was educated in New York City public schools. Later in life, she furthered her education and at Medgar Evers College in Brooklyn, New York, where she obtained a Bachelor of Science Degree in Accounting. 
