and always will too.

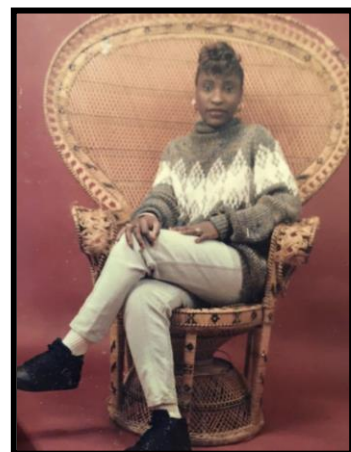
