
A Daughter's Cry



Celebration of Life of Deacon David Franklin Ballard

Deacon David Franklin Ballard was born on October 30, 1952, in Columbia, SC. He was the youngest child of the late Peter Richard Ballard, Jr. and Pearlo Watson Ballard. He departed this life on Friday, December 24, 2021, in the comfort of his home with his family.

David was educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina. His formal education was obtained in Richland School District One, where he attended Fairwold, Keenan, and C. A. Johnson High School. After completion of high school, David immediately began working as a cook, something he enjoyed doing until his health declined. David's career in residential and building construction and roofing began in the early 1970s. He mastered this trade through hands-on training with United Brick Work, under the instruction of the late Reverend Charles Jackson and Gordon Plastering. David was also a meticulous lawn care worker; he was employed by many families for the upkeep and beautification of their properties.

David was baptized at an early age at Gill Creek Baptist Church, of Columbia, SC. He later joined Grunter's Chapel Baptist Church, where he faithfully attended and sang on the choir during his young adult years. As the years would pass, David separated from the church, but never forgot the love of God. Seven years prior to his decline, David rededicated his life to Christ and joined Guiding Light Ministries, under the leadership of Pastor Ida Bookert. During these years, David allowed God to use him in a mighty way; he reunited with his wife and family, served as a Deacon, and worked faithfully in his church. Deacon Ballard lived his life as a new creature in Christ, with all old things left behind.

David enjoyed life to the fullest, never complaining and always sharing a positive word. He had an unprecedented way of expressing his love for others and a desire to be happy beyond understanding.
