

#### **The Creation**

#### The Journey

**Rue Belle** eventually grew up and moved to Columbia, SC, at the age of thirteen to continue her education. She graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 1946, where she caught the eye of Mr. Harry Mickens, Jr., and they married on January 17, 1947. They were married for more than 56 years, before his death in 2003. And God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it." To this glorious union, seven children were conceived.

She attended all of her Class Reunions. She really seemed very youthful every 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday. **Go Tornadoes**!

**Mother** was an active member of Antioch Baptist Church on Koon Road for more than **eighty-one** years. She held numerous positions in various auxiliaries and served on several committees. She was a member of the Adult Sunday School class, Missionary Society, and the Antioch Women's Auxiliary. She also participated in the church's weekly exercise program and mid-week Bible study. She was well loved and respected by her Church family.

Mother was also a staunch community activist in both the Farrow Hills and Greenview communities. She walked up to five miles per day at least three days a week; she was a yoga enthusiast; and she was an active member of the Greenview Park Adult exercise program. She maintained a beautiful rose garden and vegetable garden. She never had an unkind thought towards anyone, nor an unkind word. **Proverbs 31:10-31** describes our Mother and how she lived her life!
