

Ulysses "Love" Pressley was born on June 12, 1931 in Columbia, SC. He peacefully entered eternal rest at the age of 90 on January 24, 2022 at home .

Jlysses was the third of seven children born to Jacob and Winnie Pressley. It was said that the five boys were named after generals, and early in life he also acquired the nickname "Love." He attended Richland County public schools and graduated from C.A. Johnson High School where he played on the football team. He later attended Denmark Technical College. Ulysses went on to proudly serve in both the U.S. Army and the U.S. Air Force in World War II and the Korean War. He started working at an early age helping his father at a dry cleaner. During adulthood, he worked for Colonial Grocery Store, Farrow Road Bowling Alley, Cardinal Chemicals and 30 years with the R.L. Bryan Co.

Known for his outspokenness and gift of gab, Ulysses never met a stranger. In later years, his greatest joy was spending time with his children, grandchildren and family. He was a lifelong member of Wesley United Methodist Church and longtime member of Disabled American Veterans, Clayton Chapter 28.


