Mrs. June Ethel Robinson, the beloved daughter of Vernon Jenkins and Theresa Green-Haynes, was born September 15, 1933, in Ruffin, South Carolina. June was raised on the family farm by her grandparents, who instilled strong Christian values and a fastidious work ethic.

June demonstrated an early affinity for learning. Her early memories included riding to grade school on the family mule and reading by the lantern. She attended Ruffin High School where she excelled. She took that love of learning and spirit of hard work to South Carolina State University in Orangeburg, SC, where she graduated with honors. June was a true trail-blazer. She later earned a Master of Social Work from Columbia University in New York, at a time where very few women of color were getting advanced degrees from Ivy League institutions.

While at South Carolina State University SCSU, she met the love of her life, Converse Robinson. June and Converse were joined in Holy Matrimony and remained happily married for over 50 years, living in Panama, Puerto Rico, and New York City. Their union was blessed with two children, Terri Robinson and David Robinson.

June went on to forge a thirty year career in Social Work holding positions as Caseworker, Supervisor, and Field Supervisor before retiring as the Director of Child Support Enforcement for Bureau of Child Welfare for the City of New York. Upon retirement June and Converse returned to South Carolina, residing in Irmo for over thirty years.

June accepted Jesus Christ at an early age, at Buckhead United Methodist Church in Ruffin S.C. While in New York, she was a member at Cambria Heights Community Church and held numerous leadership positions in The Reformed Church in America. After moving back to South Carolina, she joined Pleasant Spring A.M.E. Church. There she served for many years in a variety of roles which included Steward, Class Leader, Sunday School Teacher, Lay Organization, Stewardess, Missionary, Hospitality Committee, Evangelism Leader. At the time of her passing she was the Mother of the Church.



June gave unselfishly. She was an active member in the South Carolina State College Alumni Association New York Chapter for many years. She and Converse worked tirelessly to support the Annual South Carolina State College Scholarship Dinner Dance & Boat Ride. She was a member of numerous civic and community organizations, a lifetime member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. and a charter member of the Pi PHI OMEGA Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority in South-eastern Queens.

She served on the Board of Directors for Southern Normal School, a junior and senior high boarding school, in Brewton Alabama founded in 1911 by James Dooley. The school was operated under the Board of Domestic Missions of the Reformed Church in America in 1919. Until 1969, it was the only school in Brewton that educated African Americans. June's charity did not stop there her acts of kindness were endless.

She volunteered in the Irmo Public Schools, was always caring and cooking for family, making her signature pound cakes for church and helping those in need. She loved her immediate and extended family and was the caregiver for her late husband Converse and her Aunt Helen during their final years.

June was a faithful Christian, a devoted wife, a loving mother, and a giving grandmother and great grandmother. She was courageous in life and death. On January 27, 2022 at her home in Irmo, God's angels came to claim Junes spirit and take her to a place free of pain, sickness and sorrow.

Those left to cherish her memory are her brother Edwin Haynes, daughter Terri Robinson (Charles Wyatt), son David Robinson (Gregg Robinson); grandchildren: Darlene Robinson, Starlyn Robinson (Kenon McKissack), David Myles Robinson; great-grandson Kairo, a host of cousins, other relatives and friends.
