



## Reflections of the Life of Theron Naeem Wallace

An inspiration to life itself, Theron Naeem Wallace was born January 23, 2001, in St. Louis, Missouri. His parents are Dr. Weldon Wayne Wallace and Franquelletta Manigault Wallace. Theron was called to his Heavenly home on December 25, 2021.

They chose the name Theron Naeem for its meaning "Hunter" and "Happiness" and "Comfort". Theron's joy for nature, spiritual growth, and exploration of his inner-self, with focus on the consumption of natural resources and bringing people together, are endearing examples of what he stood for and how his name complimented him.
