(1976 – 2022)

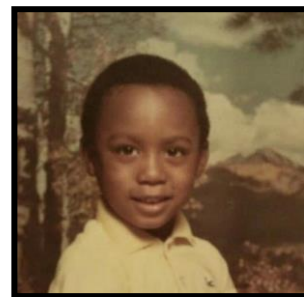
Mr. Shon DeLeon Brown was born in Columbia, SC on May 7, 1976. He departed this life to take eternal rest on February 21, 2022.
