

Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Ola Ruth Weeks Earley

"Don't grieve for me, for now I'm free. I'm following the path God has laid you see. I took his hand when I heard His call. I turned my back and left it all. Lift up your heart and peace to thee—God wanted me now; He has set me free."

Mrs. Ola Ruth Weeks Earley was born on January 3, 1928, in the State Park Area of Columbia, South Carolina. She was the youngest child of six, born to the late Samuel and Bessie Lee Weeks. On Tuesday, March 22, 2022, God sent special angels to her home to lead the tired and weary, but brave soul of Mrs. Earley from this earthly life to rest eternally with Him.

Mrs. Earley was educated in the public schools of Columbia. She graduated from Booker T. Washington High School, Class of 1946. She furthered her education at Allen University, where she earned a bachelor's degree in Home Economics. After college, she was employed as a school teacher in the Dillion and Great Falls areas of South Carolina. Mrs. Earley retired after 30 dedicated years of working for the State of South Carolina.
