SFC (Ret) Melvin Eugene Whittemore was born on July 18, 1940, in Boaz, Kentucky, to Rastus and Ollie B. Hobbs Whittemore. He departed this life surrounded by family, on Friday, March 11, 2022, at Prisma Health Baptist Hospital.

Melvin joined the Hickory Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Hickory, Kentucky at an early age. He was a graduate of Dunbar High School, in Mayfield, Kentucky. He worked various jobs before answering his country's call to serve in the United States Army.

His military career included numerous assignments stateside and abroad to include: Germany, Vietnam, and Korea. During his second tour in Germany, he attended the NCO Academy. Melvin received numerous medals and awards throughout his career. After 23 years of honorable service to his country, Sergeant First Class Whittemore retired at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, where he made Columbia his home.
