Obituary

Reverend Mr. Willie Benjamín Ellis, Jr., was a man of God who was loved, is missed, and will always be cherished.

He was born on February 20, 1946, in Columbia, South Carolina, to Reverend Willie Benjamin Ellis, Sr. and Luvenia Thompson Ellis Barber. He transitioned to be with his heavenly father on Sunday, April 10, 2022.

Reverend Ellis was educated in the public schools of Richland County, SC, and graduated from C. A. Johnson High School in 1964. He attended Columbia Commercial College, where he earned a degree in Business Management. In 1968, Reverend Ellis entered the United States Army, and was a Vietnam Veteran. He was a member of the South Carolina Combat Veteran Group, and served as the chaplain.

Reverend Ellis was also employed at Fairmont Tamper, Inc. in West Columbia, and retired after serving 35 years.
