Reflections of the Life of Dr. Sonya Michelle Davis Lewis

Dr. Sonya Michelle Davis Lewis was born March 27, 1966, in Columbia, South Carolina, to George Davis and Carolyn Baxley. Her untimely departure from this life came on the afternoon of Saturday, May 7, 2022.

Dr. Sonya Davis Lewis received her early education in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina. She graduated from Frederick Douglass High School, in Upper Marlboro, and continued until ultimately receiving her doctorate degree.

Sonya enjoyed every aspect of life. She relished quality time with her loving family. She looked forward to planning adventures that allowed her to hang out with her friends. Her light, airy, and joyful spirit was evident as she continuously added to her collection of Mickey and Minnie Mouse stuffed characters.

Dr. Lewis was a humanitarian and servant leader. She could often be found leading the charge to serve those who seemed to be forgotten by the system. Very near and dear to her heart was advocating for victims of domestic violence. She was a longtime supporter of Sister Care, where she worked tirelessly for the safety of the victims, and for laws to protect these victims.

Dr. Sonya, as she was affectionately called, was the Executive Director of the nonprofit, My Sister's Voice. My Sister's Voice assists victims of sexual assault, sexual trauma, and other acts of violence. The primary focus of My Sister's Voice is to ensure that women, children, and vulnerable citizens live in safe, habitable conditions. Sonya received many awards over the past few months, and was beginning to be recognized as a rising star, and a formidable force in the area of human rights advocacy.

Sonya recently became a member of Saint John Baptist Church, where she quickly became active in the Domestic Violence Ministry, and assisted community members through the Saint John Food Pantry. She was a member of the Boykin, Epps, Gist, and Jackson Ministry Unit. She enjoyed attending church, and as COVID restrictions were lifting, she was very excited to begin working with other ministries of her new church home.
