SMSgt (Ret) Harry Nearing Jr., was born on August 26, 1935, in White Cloud, Michigan. He was the first black baby to be born in White Cloud. He was the second of five children of the late Harry Nearing, Sr. and Sara E. Nearing.

He attended the public schools of Muskegon Heights, Michigan. Harry went on to serve his country honorably in the United States Airforce for 28 years. He later received his associates degree from Midlands Technical College in Criminal Justice. After retiring from the Air Force, Harry became employed with the Department of Juvenile Justice for 20 years as a correctional officer.

Harry was an active member of New Covenant Missionary Baptist Church. He held several offices, and received numerous awards of recognition. He was ordained as Deacon in October 2010. Deacon Nearing also served as trustee chairperson from 1997 to 2022.
