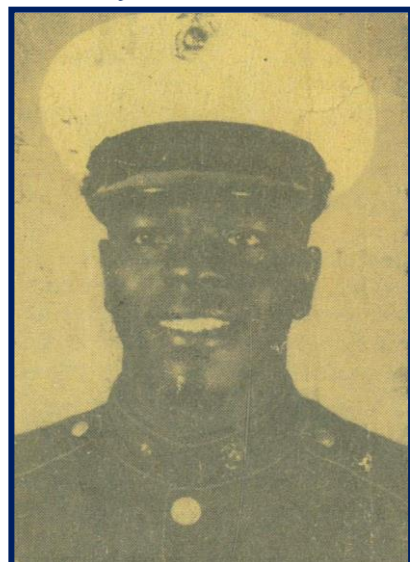


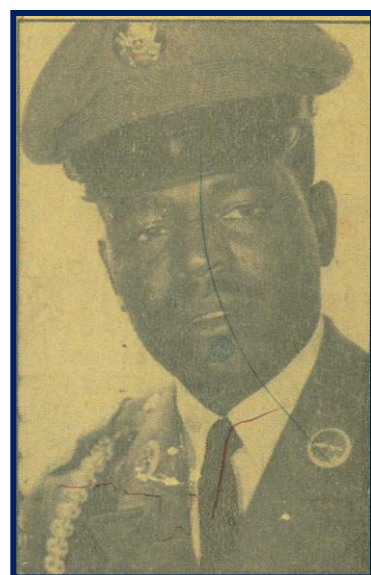

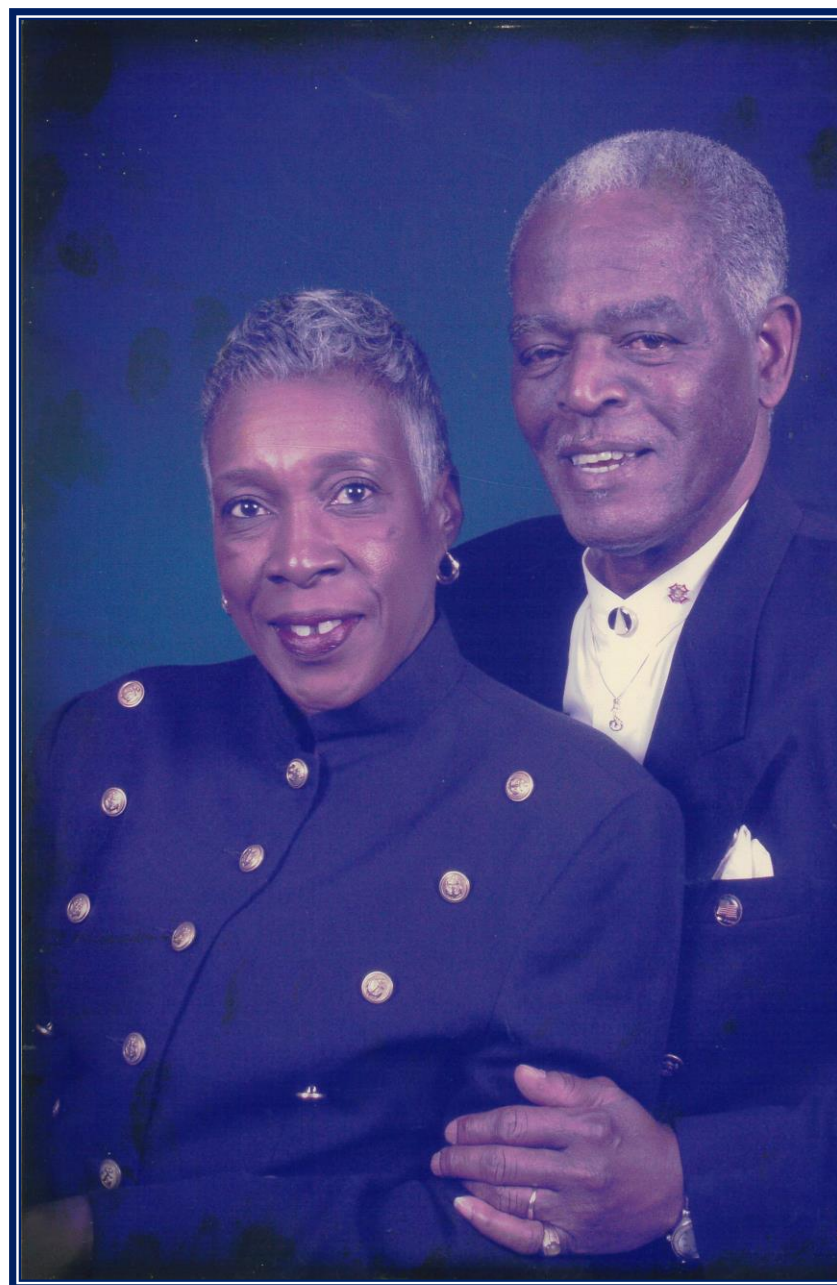

Obituary

Mr. Charles Ray Scott was born on September 25, 1938, in Huntsville, Texas. He was the second son of the late Herndon and Bernice Hunt Scott. He departed this life on Wednesday, May 18, 2022. At an early age, Charles joined St. James United Methodist Church, in Huntsville, Texas.

Charles was educated in the public schools of Walker County, Texas. He was a graduate of Sam Houston High School, where he played football, baseball, and ran track. Upon graduating from high school, Charles attended Tyler College, in Tyler, Texas. He later joined the United States Army, where he received a Bronze Star and Purple Heart. After being honorably discharged from the United States Army, he became employed with the US Postal Service, where he was the Mail Handlers Union Representative. Charles gave 30 years of dedicated service, to the US Postal service and retired in February 2002.

He was an avid sportsman prior to his health declining. He loved bowling, and was a member of the VFW's bowling league for many years. He held a life membership with the VFW Post 4262, where he served on the House Committee. Charles also served as a member of the American Legion Post 215. He could always be counted on to donate to several projects. Charles loved playing softball with the US Postal Service. He also loved fishing, and playing chess, of which he was very good. Charles loved transporting patients to their appointments at the VA Hospital.

In addition to his parents, Charles was preceded in death by his sister, Dorothy Scott.
