



# Reflections of the Life of MSgt. (Ret.) Paul Wade

MSgt. (Ret.) Paul Wade was born on October 21, 1928, in Jackson, Mississippi. He was the son of Luddie Wade and Alice Rhodes Wade Boyd, of Mississippi. He departed this life on Monday, May 16, 2022.

Mr. Wade was educated in the public schools of Jackson, Mississippi, and graduated from Lanier High School, in 1946. He enlisted in the United States Army upon graduating from high school. After his tour, he enrolled in Jackson College, now known as Jackson State University, and received his degree in education in 1952. He later received his master's degree from New York University. After graduation, he made his way to Columbia, South Carolina. He was hired to teach Industrial Arts at Booker T. Washington High School. After the closing of Booker T. Washington High School, he transferred to Richland County School District One. He taught at WJ Keenan High School, Webber Elementary, and AC Flora High School. He retired after 30 years of service.

He was a lifetime member of the NAACP, Retired Teachers Association, North Columbia Civic Club, Concerned Citizens Club for Farrow Hills, and Farrow Terrace. He worked tireless hours for his Greenview Community. He was instrumental in the revitalization of Greenview Park. He was an active member of Second Calvary Baptist Church, for over 50 years serving as a Deacon and Chairman of the Trustee Board.

Paul enjoyed fishing, gardening, hunting, watching westerns, ETV (Father Brown), and working with his hands building homemade cedar chest, bookshelves, gun racks, and armoires.

Mr. Wade was preceded in death by: his parents, Luddie Wade and Alice Rhodes Wade Boyd; his wife, Yvonne Ramsey Wade; sisters, Ruthie Mae, Geneva, Mable, and Dorothy Jean; brothers, Johnny Quincy (JQ) and Emmett Sr.; and a grandson, Frederick A. Clinton.


