Miss me-but let me go.*

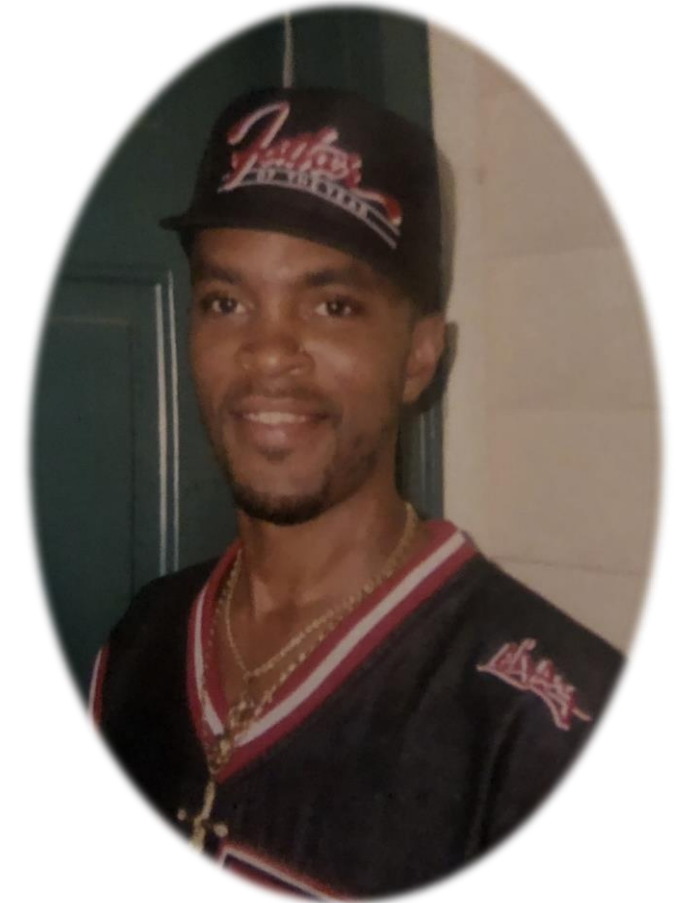
*For this is a journey that we all must take
