## Obituary

Quentine Irwin Watson was born on May 1, 1994 in Valdosta, Ga. He was the youngest child of Felix Irwin Watson and Castalia Inez Small Watson. He departed this life on Friday, 24 June, 2022.

Quentine began his education at Yokota AB, Japan, and completed his high school education at White Knoll High School, in Lexington, SC in 2012. He was a member of the marching band from 7th grade through high school graduation, winning consecutive 5-A state championships in 2010 and 2011. He was also in the Jazz Band and Concert Band. Quentine completed his formal education at Newberry College, earning a bachelor of arts degree, with a Music Theory emphasis and a Music Business Minor in 2016. During this time, Quentine was also a member of the Newberry College Marching Band. Quentine Watson, along with his friends, Alex Hill and Brandon Martin, formed a band known as Novelist. They produced one album labeled Colorless, with Quentine playing bass. Novelist was released September 13, 2019. His favorite song of the album was titled Bright Eyes.
