# Reflections of the Life of Mr. James Franklin "Cowboy" Htterbury, Sr.

Mr. James Franklin **Cowboy** Atterbury, Sr. was born on May 28, 1942, in Bamberg County, South Carolina. He was the son of the late CPL Clarence Atterbury, Sr. and Alice Daniels Atterbury. He departed this life into eternal rest on July 3, 2022.

**Cowboy** was educated in the public schools of Richland County, South Carolina, and graduated from Booker T. Washington High School, class of 1960.

**Cowboy** played professional baseball for the Philadelphia Stars, of the Negro Baseball League, and was a professional baseball player for Chicago Cubs and California Angels of the major league organizations. Prior to joining the Negro and Major Leagues, he played collegiate baseball at Allen University.

After baseball, **Cowboy** dedicated many years working at Bethesda Naval Shipyard. **Cowboy** later launched his own painting company, All Pro Painting, LLC, in Danville, Virginia.

He was a faithful servant of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, in Danville, Virginia.

In addition to his father, **Cowboy** was preceded in death by his sisters, Dorothy Knotts, Lillie Gibson, and Betty Rosario.
