Obituary

Mr. Paul Monroe Cuff was born on August 18, 1935 in Hackensack, New Jersey. He was the only child of the late Monroe Cuff and Martha Cuff.

Mr. Cuff was educated in the Hackensack public schools, and graduating with the class of 1953. Mr. Cuff furthered his education at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Teaneck, New Jersey. Mr. Cuff served in the United States National Guard, at Fort Drum, in Jefferson, New York.

Mr. Cuff was baptized at an early age, at Mt. Olive Baptist Church, in Hackensack, NJ., and stayed involved in the church, as he grew up.

Mr. Cuff had a passion for graphics and art. He worked hard to develop his trade as a printer, while also taking advantage of living near New York City, and seeking out art in museums and art festivals. He worked for Prentice Hall, in New Jersey for several years. He also worked out of his home in the basement, producing jobs for Monroe's Printing Service, in Teaneck, New Jersey.

Mr. Cuff eventually went to work at The Printing Hub, in Fair Lawn, NJ. He eventually bought out the owner of the shop in the early 1980s, and renamed it, The Able Printing Hub. While running his successful business in the town, he joined and eventually became the President of The Lions Club of Fair Lawn, a predominantly white town. He was the first person of color to become the president, and later chairman of the club. After almost two decades of successful business, Mr. Cuff closed his print shop in 2007, and retired from printing, while living with his new bride, Rachel Noble, in Paterson, NJ.

In 2008, he and his wife Rachel Bush Cuff relocated to Indian Land, SC, and started their post work life together. They attended Steel Hill A.M.E. Zion Church, in Lancaster, SC.

He satisfied his passion for arts and graphics by taking on photography as a hobby while retired. He would often submit his pictures to local competitions, and his work was often been a part of public art shows in the area. He instilled his deep love of art to his son, Christopher and granddaughter, Christa.

Mr. Paul Monroe Cuff leaves to mourn his passing: his wife, Rachel Bush Cuff; his sons, Christopher Monroe Cuff, of Kissimmee, FL and Kevin Eugene Cuff, of Berkley, CA; a daughter, Valerie Jones, of Paterson, New Jersey; seven grandchildren, ten great-grandchildren, many other living relatives, all of whom will miss him greatly.
