### Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Helen Marie Staley Culver

Helen Marie Staley Culver was born on August 9, 1934, in Springfield, South Carolina, to the late Louis and Louise Amos-Staley. Helen attended Springfield Elementary and Junior High schools, then transferred to Booker T. Washington High School, in Columbia, South Carolina. In May of 1953, Helen married the late Robert Culver, and to that union, they raised two daughters, Audrey and Paulette. Years later, Helen gave birth to a son, Walter Reed, and also raised her late grandson, Marcus Staley. After high school, Helen migrated to Brooklyn, New York, where she worked as a volunteer for the New York City school system. Helen was later employed by the New York Telephone Company (now known as AT&T), where she worked as an 800 operator, and received numerous service awards for outstanding service. She retired after 25 years in 1994.

After retiring, Helen moved back to Columbia, South Carolina, where she got involved with countless community services, volunteering her services, and giving of herself wherever needed. She served on the tenants screening committee at 1930 Marion Street, and worked faithfully volunteering for the Board of Elections, in Columbia, until she moved to Rosewood Hill Senior Complex. She leaves an extended family of friends, who came to know and love her. Helen has always been full of joy, giving, comical, stylish, classy, loving, and a charismatic person, who enjoyed life and people. Her love for family and gatherings will be missed tremendously. Helen's gift of baking famous chocolate layer, pineapple upside down, and butter cakes will be missed, by all who had the pleasure of tasting those wonderful sweets. She was a loving mother, grandmother, sister, and great friend who would uplift and encourage your spirit.
