## Obituary

Mr. Rastapari Hailstock was called home to be with the Lord on Monday, July 25, 2021. He was born on December 13, 1931, in Sharon, Pennsylvania. He was the youngest child of the late Elesie and Clara Durrah Hailstock. Mr. Hailstock was reared in Charlotte, NC, by William and Lillian Castor, after the death of his mother.

Mr. Hailstock was educated in the public schools of Mecklenburg County, North Carolina. He was a graduate of Second Ward High school, Charlotte, North Carolina, class of 1949. He attended Shaw University and Carver College and graduated with a degree in Liberal Arts and Business Administration.

He served in the United States Army as a paratrooper at Fort Benning, Georgia. While serving in the army, he married his loving wife of 70 years, the former Marguerite White.

He later moved to Farrell, Pa, to be close to his father and siblings. He worked in the family bakery and was later employed by Sharon Steel. In 1976, he was hired by the City of Farrell as the first black Public Health and Code officer for 20 years.

Mr. Hailstock was a member of Second Baptist Church, Farrell, PA, where he was ordained as a Deacon in 1974. He served as the Chairman of the Deacons' Ministry for 15 years, and as the Vice-Chairman for 12 years. He also served as a Senior Sunday School Class teacher, member of the Men's Fellowship, and on the auditing and search committees. While living in Farrell, he was the president of the N.A.A.C.P. for ten years, a board member for the Southwest Gardens, Community Action-Head Start Program, and the Farrell Human Relations. Mr. Hailstock was also a member of the Calumet Lodge #25 F&AM (PHA).

After becoming ill, he moved to South Carolina to live with his daughters, Pamela and Judy. He later joined Brookland Baptist Church, West, where he was appointed Deacon Emeritus.

Mr. Hailstock was preceded in death by his son, Rastapari Hailstock, Jr.; parents, Reverend Elesie and Clara Hailstock, William and Lillian Castor; three brothers, Romason, Arverdison, and Emanuel, and a sister Eunice Coleman.

Deacon Hailstock leaves to cherish beautiful memory: his wife, Marguerite Hailstock; two daughters, Judy E. Johnson and Pamela (Randy) Davis; two grandchildren Milton E. Johnson, Jr. and Julius (Dominique) X. 
