**Mr. Marvin Leo Pinckney was born on August 6, 1948, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the youngest child of the late Henry and Naomi Pinckney. He departed this life on Tuesday, July 26, 2022.**

**Mr. Pinckney was educated in the public school of Richland County, South Carolina, and graduated from C.A. Johnson High School, class of 1966. He was drafted into the United States Army at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and served in Vietnam. After his tour of service ended, he made Columbia, South Carolina his home. He retired after many dedicated years working for the Columbia Housing Authority. *Big Pink*, as he was affectionately called, was baptized at an early age, and joined Progressive Church of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. *Miss Me But Let Me Go*

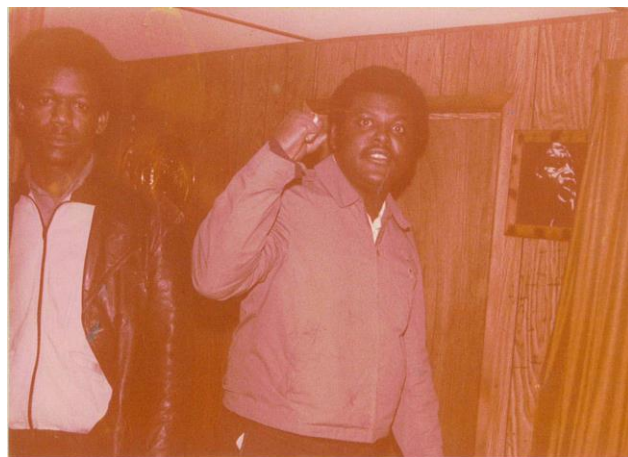
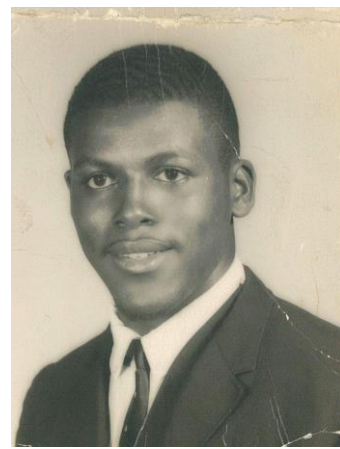
*When I come to the end of the road

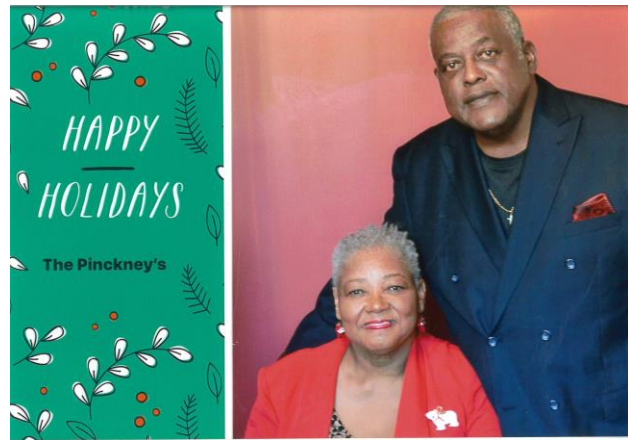
