## *Obituary*

Mr. Samuel Scott, Jr. was born on January 15, 1972, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the youngest child of the late Samuel Scott, Sr. and Virginia Y. Scott.

On the evening of Monday, July 4, 2022, *Sam* passed away at his home, from a heart attack, after enjoying a fun holiday with close friends. He was 50 years old.

He was preceded in death by, his three older siblings from his mother's first marriage to the late Alonzo Chisolm, Sr., Renee Vanessa Chisolm Outen, Alonzo Chisolm, Jr., and Reginald Talmadge Chisolm.

*Sam* was educated in the public schools of Richland County, and attended C.A. Johnson High School. He worked most of his adult life in the construction industry, and was known for his work ethic, technical knowledge, and problem-solving skills, to ensure a project stayed on track.

Like his father, he was able to repair everything from televisions to washing machines. He was called on by friends, family, and neighbors to fix household items.

In 2020, he contracted a rare invasive fungal infection that almost took his life and stole his sight. But like his mother, he was a fighter, and while devastated by the loss of his quality of life, he kept trying to adjust to his blindness and found purpose. He reengaged in life, with the support and encouragement of friends and family.

*Sam* leaves to survive his departure to heaven: five children, Diamond (Henry) Dukes, Antonio Samuels, Samantha Scott, ZaNiya Norris, and Tamara Scott; three grandchildren; two sisters, Gwendolyn Yvonne Blondy Chisolm, of Jonesboro, GA and Monica L. Scott, of Grand Rapids, MI; many uncles, aunts, nieces, nephews, cousins, and his personal care aide, Ms. Janie Powell, all of whom will miss him dearly.
