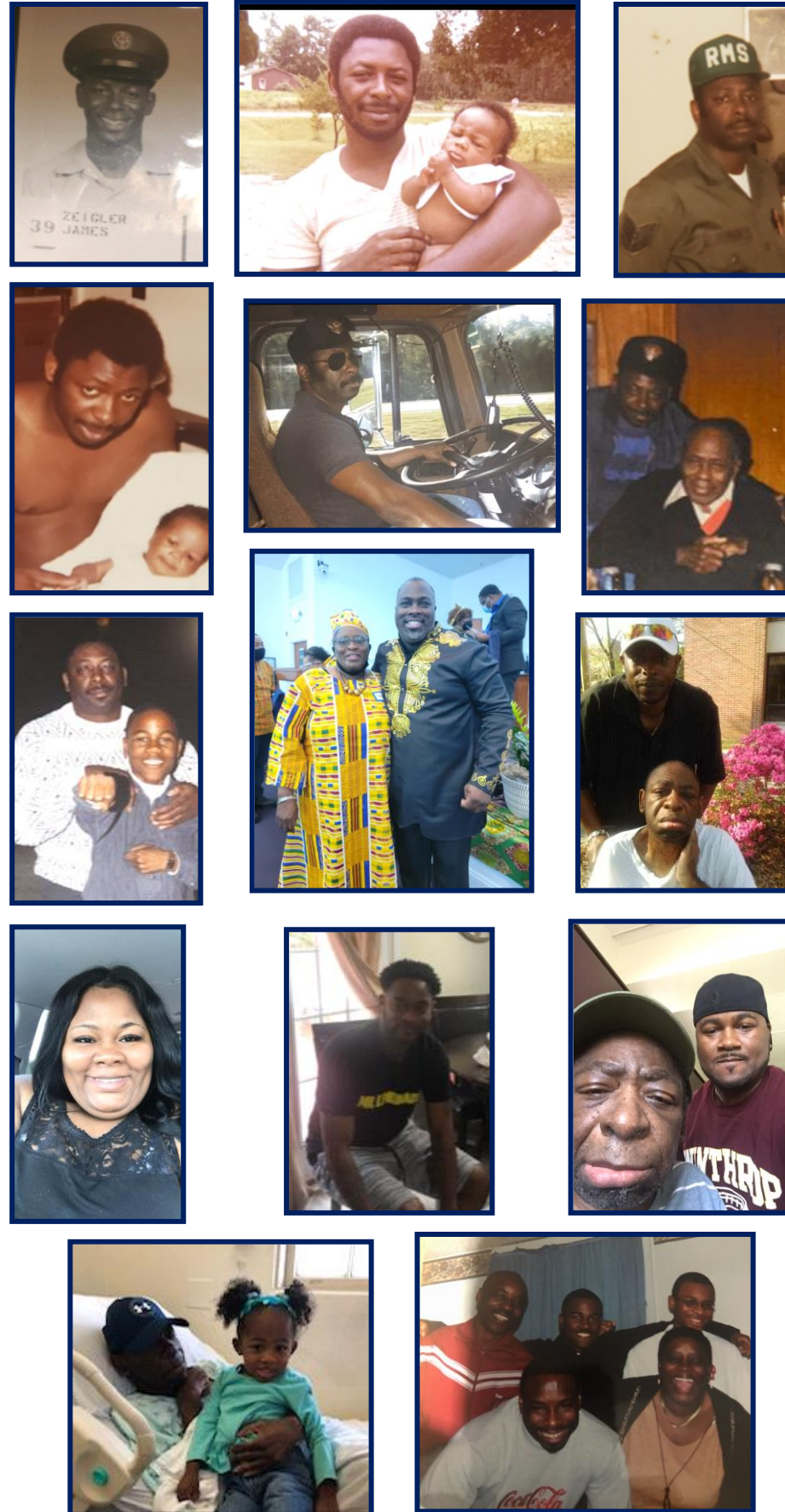
He was a faithful member of Mt. Pisgah A.M.E Church, in St. Matthews, SC, until the decline of his health.
