

#### Obituary

April 30, 1943 - August 24, 2022

**Reverend Joseph English** was born on April 30, 1943, in Lexington County, South Carolina. He was the sixth of nine children born to the late Abram C. and Victoria Foster English. He entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, August 24, 2022.

He received his early education in the public schools of Lexington County School District Two, graduating from Lakeview High School in 1962. While at Lakeview, he served in a number of clubs and organizations including: Honor Society, Student Council, Future Teachers of America, Science Club, and sports editor of the newspaper. He lettered in football and scorekeeping for the basketball team. He was the valedictorian of his class. His education continued at Benedict College, in Columbia, South Carolina, where he received a B.S. Degree in Chemistry in 1966. During his collegiate years, he was selected to Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, Vice President of Alpha Kappa Mu Honor Society, and member of the Science Club. He graduated Magna Cum Laude. He earned a Master of Education Degree in Education Administration from the University of South Carolina, in 1975. He engaged in further studies at Limestone, Columbia International University, and Midlands Technical College. His career in education spanned thirty years, serving as a teacher, assistant principal, and principal.

His career in education began at Lakeview High School, his alma mater, as a science teacher. He rose to assistant principal at Brookland-Cayce High School, and later returned to Northside Middle School, the former Lakeview School, as principal. He became principal of Cyril B. Busbee Middle, in Cayce, South Carolina, and remained in that capacity until retirement. As principal, he earned the distinguished Principal of the Year Award.

**Reverend English** was affiliated with the Greater Saint Paul African Methodist Church, in West Columbia, South Carolina, where he received Christ as a teenager. His activities in the church included: member of the Steward Board, Sunday School Superintendent, Sunday School Teacher, Director of Vacation Bible School, and many other areas of service.

Reverend English served as a board member on numerous non-profit organizations: Vice Chairman for the Christian Learning Center of the Midlands, Associate Dean for the Congress of Education Gethsamane Association, President of the Bluff Road Ministerial Alliance, and Moderator of the Easter Sunrise Fellowship of Churches, Secretary of the Bluff Road Shalom Zone CDC, President of the Eau Claire Ministerial Alliance, and Board Member of the Brookland Lakeview Empowerment Center. He was actively engaged in the education of children through School Time Bible of South Carolina, and Youth Corps. He was a member of the National Education Association (NEA) and South Carolina Education Association-Retired (SCEA-R).

**Reverend English** answered the call into the ministry at Greater Saint Paul African Methodist Church. He then served as Associate Minister at St. James Baptist Church under Dr. Edward Kinard. He served as pastor of Zion Chapel Baptist Church #2, in Columbia, South Carolina from 1992 to 1999. In August of 1999, God led him to find the Kingdom Builders Ministries, where he served as pastor until his health declined. His ministry was rooted in discipleship and community service.

He was a pillar of the community, with a tender heart full of encouragement. Reverend English was a prayer warrior and mentor to many. He had an uncanny gift of words and rhymes. He was a masterful storyteller and embraced the title, The Hambone Man. He was also known in the community as an avid vegetable gardener.

He was an active and supporting Benedict College alumnus, supporting financially as a member of the Benedict College National Alumni Association and serving in the local Benedict Tiger West Alumni Club as chaplain and student recruitment committee member. He was also a member of the Benedict College Half-Century Club.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by: his sisters, Vernelle (the late Joe) Smith, Geneva (the late Willie) Robinson, and Matilda Porterfield; brothers, Rev. Abram C. English, Jr. and Roosevelt English.

Reverend Joseph English leaves to cherish his precious memory: his devoted wife of over 58 years, Reverend Janis Kohn English; daughter, Victoria English, of Kannapolis, North Carolina; sons, Noelton (Rebecca) English, of Gaston, South Carolina and Carlton (Carla) English, of Manville, New Jersey; sister, Cedelle (James T.) Gates, of West Columbia, South Carolina; brothers, Henry (Lenora) English and Melvin English, both of Gaston, South Carolina; sisters-in-law, Rosemary B. English and Margaret A.
