Reflections of the Life of Mrs. Carolyn Lavon Frazier

Carolyn Lavon Smith Frazier was born January 14, 1949, in Gastonia, North Carolina, to the late John Wesley Smith and Dora Mitchell. Mrs. Frazier, 73, of Columbia, South Carolina, fell asleep in death on Thursday, August 4, 2022, at home surrounded by her loving family.

She graduated from North Rockland High School in Haverstraw, New York. She met and married Jesse Frazier on August 17, 1974, and later moved to Columbia, South Carolina, to raise their family. Carolyn worked in various roles throughout her life, but her greatest joy was working with people from a very young age in daycare to the elderly in private duty. Her deep love of God, her family, and others were the guiding principles in her life.

On June 25, 1988, she was baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses at the Carolina Coliseum in Columbia, SC. Her dedication on that day would lead to numerous years of faithful service to Jehovah. Sister Frazier enjoyed field service, regularly attending meetings, and studying the Bible.
