# Reflections of the Life of Mother Florence Edith Martin Washington

Florence Edith Martin Washington was born on December 5, 1930, in Columbia, SC. She was the first of 10 children, and beloved daughter of Deacon Willie and Mother Josephine Martin. Florence took her wings like a dove, after a brief illness, and departed this earthly life to be with her Heavenly Father on Wednesday, September 21, 2022, at 3:00 a.m. At the time of her peaceful transition, she was surrounded by her family, in the home, as that was her last spoken wish to the family.

Florence was educated in the Richland County School District, of Columbia, SC, and was a graduate of Booker T. Washington High, Class of 1947. She was married to the late John Washington, Sr. and to that union, seven children were born. She was employed as a housekeeper by the Havens Family, owners of Havens Piano Company and Havens Framing. She was shipping and handling manager at Rackes Boutique on Devine. She was also an administrative assistant at Washington Family Practice. She loved unconditionally everyone who came into her life.

At an early age, Florence accepted the Lord as her Savior and in those early days, attended St. Paul Baptist Church. She became one of the 8 Founding members of Mt. Olive Baptist Church, under the pastorate of Rev. Dr. Dorothy L. Pearson, in 1956. Florence was a servant indeed and served in Mt. Olive until her health declined. Serving the Lord was her number one focus and in doing so, she served in various ministries: President of the Pastor's Aid, Chairman of the Pastor's Anniversary for 10 years, 10 years as President of the Senior Missionary Circle, she was the last member of The Original Pearson Specials Singers, the first President appointed President of the M & W Family Choir, for the first 20 years, she served as President of The Radio Choir, 4 years as Sunday School Superintendent, and 45 years as Deaconess. For many years, she was voted delegate to the Progressive National Baptist Convention. She was honored and elevated to the position of Church Mother, under the pastorate of Rev. Ella D. White on October 14, 2017.

**Mother Washington** was preceded in death by her parents; a brother, James A. Martin; and a sister, Amanda Martin. She will be missed as she wore many hats: Mom, Mama 2, BamMa, Grandma, NaNa, Sunshine, Auntie, and Friend.
