She graduated from Northeast High School. She was employed as a nurse's attendant throughout Cayce and Columbia, South Carolina.

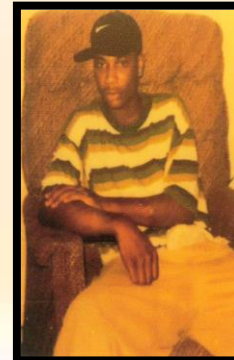
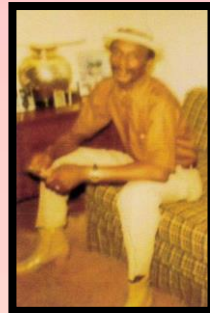
