## Life's Reflections

Rosa Lee Carr, 83, daughter of the late Thomasina and Israel Mickens, Sr., passed away on Sunday, November 27, 2022. She was a graduate of Booker T. Washington High School, in Columbia, SC and New York City College of Technology in New York, NY. Rosa was the first in her family to attend college, where she earned an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in nursing, a proud accomplishment that led to a very successful career in the medical profession.

Rosa was a beautiful and loving soul, with an inner light that shone brightly. She touched the lives of so many with her compassion, humor, kindness, and grace. Rosa was an extraordinary woman whose strength, welcoming heart, and wisdom inspired generations of family members, friends, and colleagues. She was the matriarch and "rock" of the family. She helped transform the lives of many cousins, nieces, and nephews, who lived with her in New York City, as they began new chapters of their lives.
