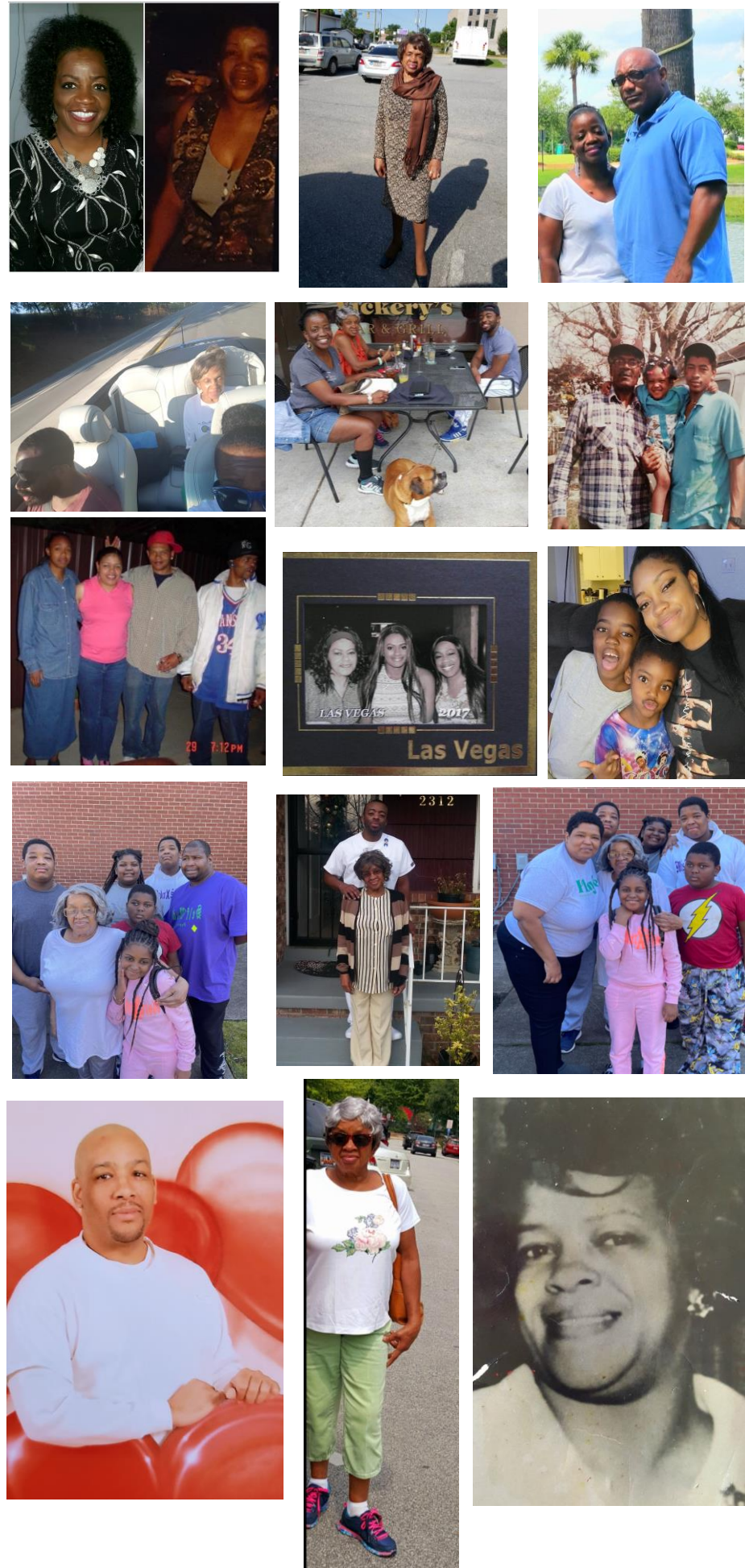
Thankful for God's grace and mercy, Ms. Carol was a flood survivor of Hurricane Katrina on August 30, 2005.
