My friend, Aunt Daisy was so particular and neat, I'll sit in awe just by watching her do something as simple as folding a sheet.

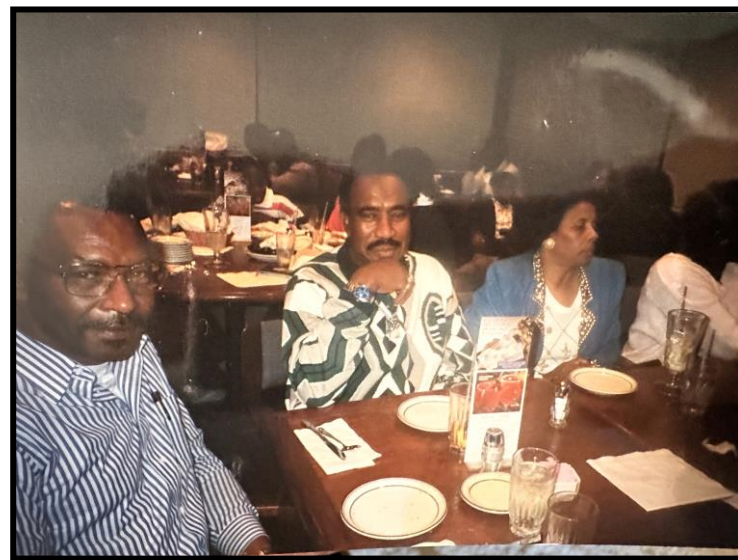
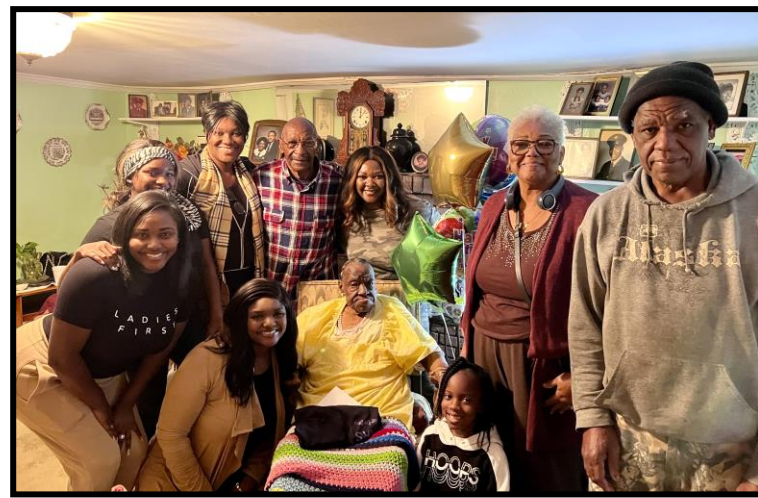
There was care in every fold, every crease... and always something on the stove to eat.

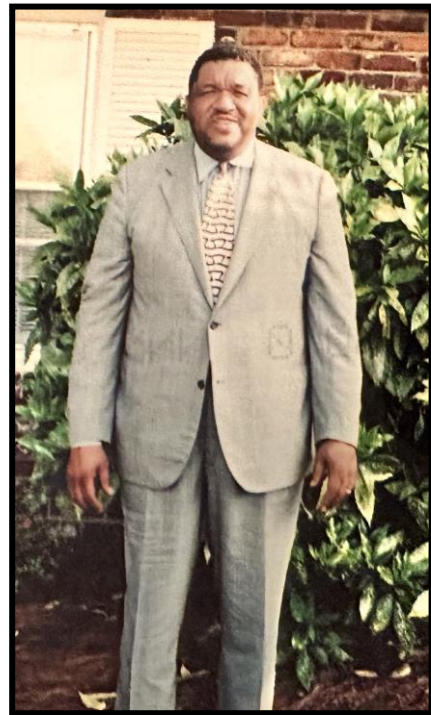
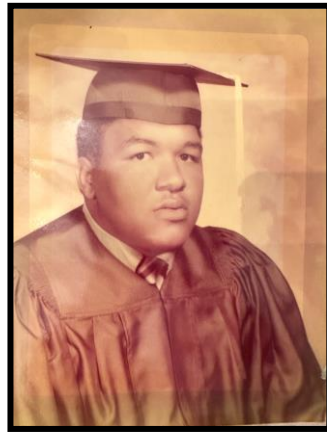
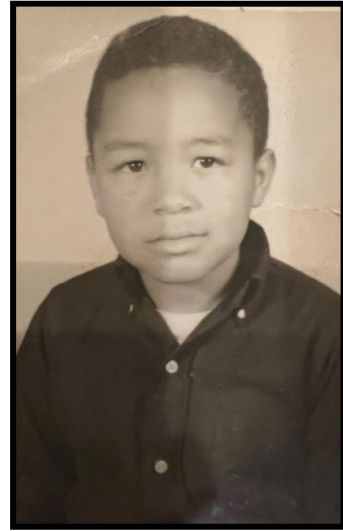
