Vivian Maxine Zimmerman Dubard of Columbia, South Carolina, widow of David Dubard Jr., passed on Saturday, December 24, 2022 at MUSC Health Medical University of South Carolina. Born in Anderson, South Carolina, she was the eldest daughter of the late John McLester Sr. and Vivian Parthenia Young Zimmerman.

Vivian's impulsive excitement for teaching was developed in her DNA. From this family, many preachers, teachers and medical professionals were born. Thus, Vivian's enthusiasm and love of teaching was driven by her parents, Mr. John and Mrs. Vivian Young Zimmerman, principal and classroom teachers.
