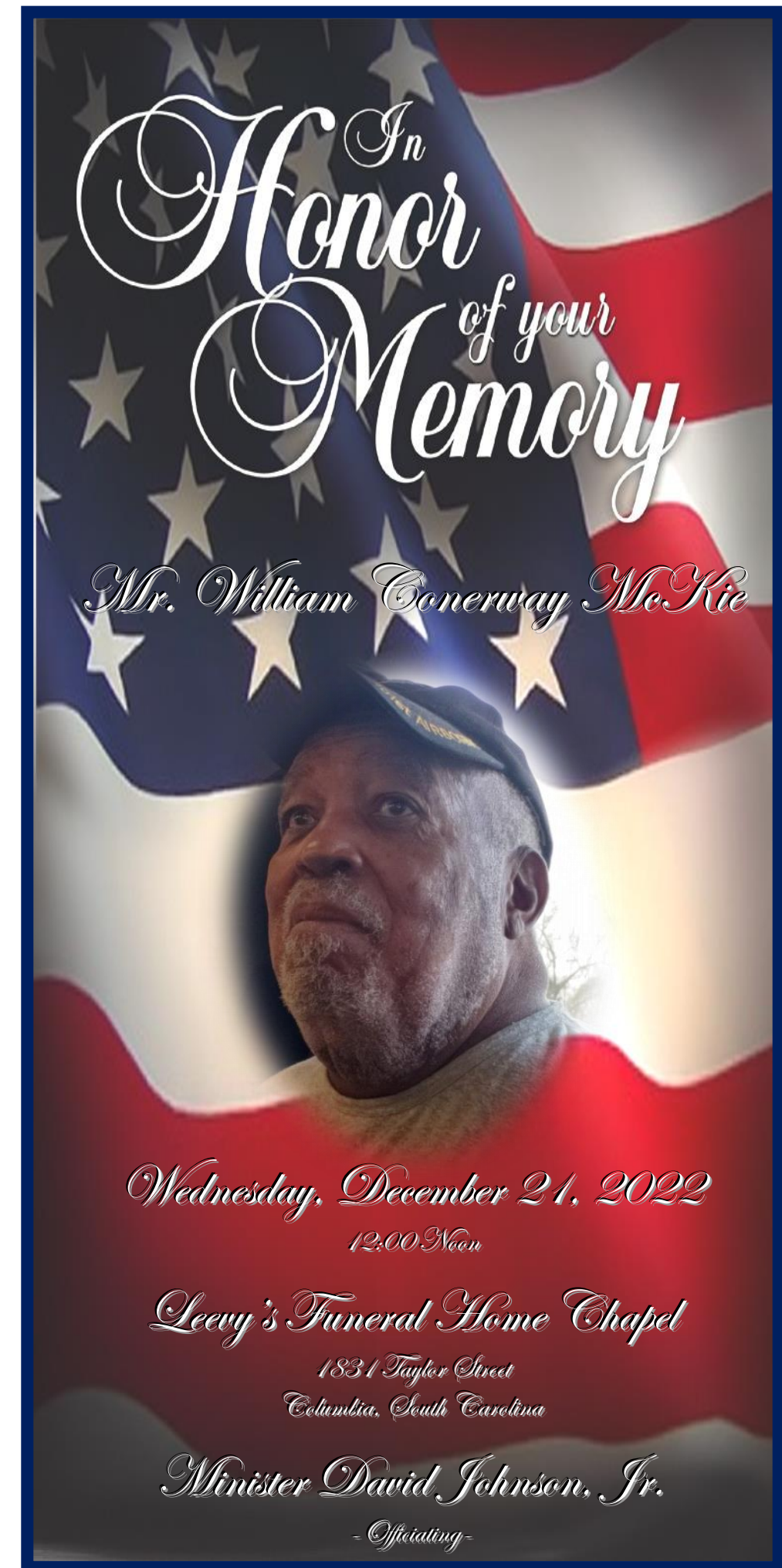

Obituary

Mr. William Conerway McKie was born on June 18, 1943, in Columbia, South Carolina. He was the third child of the late Thomas McKie and Lilly Ruth McKie. He departed this life on Monday, December 12, 2022.

Mr. McKie was educated in the public school system of Richland County, South Carolina; a graduate of C. A. Johnson High School, Class of 1961. He was drafted into the United States Army at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, where he was part of the 101st Airborne Division.

Mr. McKie also served with the Bridgeport Fire Department early in his career as a fireman.
