When you are lonely and sick at heart, Go to the friends we know And bury your sorrows in doing good deeds Miss Me - But Let Me Go.



## Obituary

Mr. Robert Louis Spigner, "Tucker," as he was affectionately called, was the second son born to the late Johnny Spigner and Lessie Dinkins on June 25, 1938. During childhood, *Tucker* lived in the Sandhills section of Eastover, on family land called Berry Bottom. He departed this life on Thursday, December 29, 2022.

*Tucker* was initially home schooled by his maternal grandfather, Robert Miller, Sr. He later attended segregated public schools in Eastover and Columbia, SC. As an adult, Robert worked as a cement finisher, trained by his stepfather, Melvin Dinkins, Sr.

He also liked to sketch and draw. He was the best dancer amongst his siblings. In the 1960s, he played the guitar and was one of the lead vocalists on a band with his brother, Sunny (Wilbert), and a few Sharpe Road neighbors. *Tucker* liked to tell funny stories and had a very gusty laugh, which earned him the nickname *Tucker*. He was also called *Brother or Bro* by close family members and *Chicken* or *Chick* by his close friends. He was a member of Mount Pilgrim Baptist Church, in Eastover during his younger years, and later attended Gunter's Chapel Baptist Church.

*Tucker* is survived by his wife, Frances Chitty Tucker; stepdaughter, Robin Graham-Adams, of Atlanta, Georgia; two sisters, Florie S. Cooke and Deloris Rogers; one brother, Wilbert Dinkins, all of Columbia, South Carolina. He spent his last weeks being taken care of at the home of his niece and nephew-in-law, Christie and James Jeffcoat, of Columbia, South Carolina; he is also survived by a host of other loving nieces, nephews, cousins, and other relatives.
