#### In Remembrance

Mother Carrie Lee Stallworth Cook, the oldest child of the late Matthew Stallworth and Salone Salter Stallworth was born March 28, 1933 in Evergreen, Alabama. On Friday, January 6, 2023, she quietly slipped out of time and into eternity in the early hours of the morning, leaving an eternal void in the hearts of those she loved most.

Carrie was educated in the public schools of Conecuh County, learning the basic educational necessities for the journey that would lay ahead. She ultimately graduated from Conecuh County High School, and soon after went on to receive Early Childhood Education Credits from the University of South Carolina, Columbia. She was a strong and independent woman, and for that reason she always carried the task in the forefront of her mind to make the best decisions for her daughter and herself. Carrie was a loving and doting mother to her only child, Bedra, (Steve) Starkey whom she adored, and who diligently cared for her in the latter years of her life. She was employed for many decades as a preschool teacher, and ultimately concluded her career after working in the nursery at Saint Michael's and All Angels Episcopal Church, Child Development Center for over 36 years. Hard work, dedication, determination, and a strong mind; these were the key ingredients to 89 blessed years of life.

Carrie confessed her faith in Jesus Christ and was baptized at a young age in Evergreen, Alabama. After moving to South Carolina with the love of her life, Mr. Willmont Cook, and her daughter, Bedra, she became a member of Cedar Creek Community Church. Down through the years, she served tirelessly as a member of the church and in whatever capacity the Lord needed her; there was not anything that she wouldn't do for the Lord and her church family. It was for this reason, with consideration for her loving compassion for all that she encountered, that for the past year she was known as the "Mother of the Church." She was notorious among her family and church family for her baking abilities, and her generosity that she displayed with them. However, of all of the things that she was known for, the role she held that was most paramount was a mother and helping hand to all who were in need of her loving and timeless touch. "A golden heart has stopped beating, hardworking hands are now at rest." It is for this reason that all of our worlds now shine just a little less brightly, in the absence of our mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend, Mother Carrie Lee Stallworth Cook.
