Reflections of the Life of Reverend Lewis Gunter

Reverend Lewis Gunter was born on April 13, 1930, in Lexington County, South Carolina. He was the youngest of three children born to the late Cellus and Beulah Phillips Gunter. He entered into eternal rest on Wednesday afternoon January 11, 2023, at his home in Columbia, South Carolina, where he resided for most of his adult life.

Reverend Gunter attended the public schools of Lexington County, SC. He graduated from Schofield High School, in Aiken County, SC. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy, where he served for four years. Returning home from the Navy, and in an effort to prepare himself for Christian Ministry, he enrolled at Benedict College, in Columbia, SC, where in 1971 he earned a B.A. Degree in Social Work.

Reverend Gunter began his faith journey as a child, baptized into the body of Christ on the profession of his personal faith in Jesus Christ at the Hall Hill Baptist Church, in Pelion, SC. He was licensed and ordained to preach by C.B. Freeman at St. Jehovah Baptist Church. His talent and love for singing led him to join and sing with quartet groups across the state, particularly with a group called The Silver Trumpets. It was while singing with this group, that he met and married the love of his life, Mrs. Lue Evelyn Pearson Gunter. The two were married for 56 years. During this time, they served side-by-side in pastoral ministry.

Reverend Gunter was employed by the US Postal Service, from which he retired after many years of service. He served as a Soil and Water District Commissioner, in Richland County for six years; and later served as the Minority Advisor for the Department of Agriculture, of Calhoun and Richland Counties. He also served as State Chaplain for the South Carolina Soil and Water Conservation. He served as a counselor and volunteer for various other organizations in the community. During his downtime, he loved fishing and hunting.

Reverend Gunter was called to serve as Pastor of the following churches: Mt. Olive Baptist Church, of Gadsden, SC, Gill Creek Baptist Church, of Columbia, SC, and Jerusalem Baptist Church, of Hopkins, SC.

In the fall of 1976, Reverend and Mrs. Gunter founded and organized the Gunter's Chapel Baptist Church. He provided outstanding Visionary/Pastoral leadership faithfully and dutifully for 46 years, before his retirement in May of 2022.

Pastor Gunter was preceded in death by his wife, First Lady Lue Evelyn Gunter; his two siblings; and his son, John E. Mack. He leaves to cherish profound memories: three grandchildren: John (Kim) Mack, Christopher (Angela) Mack, and Denise (Maurice) Brooks; seven great-grandchildren; two sisters-in-law, Lue Ammie (Hosea) Graham, of Johnsonville, SC and Vickie Belin, of Pamplico, SC; a host of nieces and nephews, cousins, the Gunter's Chapel Baptist Church family, and many dear friends, all of whom loved him dearly.
