Major Cecil Lathaniel Hicks, Sr., USAF (Ret) was born on September 10, 1944, to the late Juanita Hicks Walton. He was the oldest of three children. Cecil attended Sumter High School, Americus, Georgia, where he was a 1962 graduate. He was baptized at an early age at Lebanon Baptist Church in Plains, Georgia. Cecil attended Tuskegee Institute, Tuskegee, Alabama, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in Industrial Technology, on May 27, 1968.

While attending Tuskegee, he was enrolled in the ROTC program, and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the USAF on June 1, 1968. He earned a master of science in Management from Troy University in 1977. He served 20 years as a military officer, and was awarded the Bronze Star for his meritorious service. While serving his country, he, along with his family, was afforded the opportunity to see the world.

Cecil was a lifetime member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., Lamda Epsilon Chapter, where he was initiated at Tuskegee Institute on April 22, 1966.

He married his college sweetheart, LaDella Maria Matthews on November 24, 1967. They were blessed with one child, Cecil Hicks, Jr.

Following his retirement from the USAF, he worked as the Director of Human Resources for KMTV-Channel 3, in Omaha, Nebraska. He was instrumental in establishing the station's very first Human Resources Department. During his tenure in Omaha, he was very active in the community, serving on the Girl Scouts Board of Directors and holding several positions with Omega Psi Phi Beta Upsilon Chapter, where he exemplified the four cardinal principles of manhood, scholarship, perseverance, and uplift.

Cecil loved fishing, grilling, and spoiling his grandchildren. He was masterful at storytelling and adding humor to almost any situation.


