Obituary of Mrs. Debra Regina Brown-Baskett

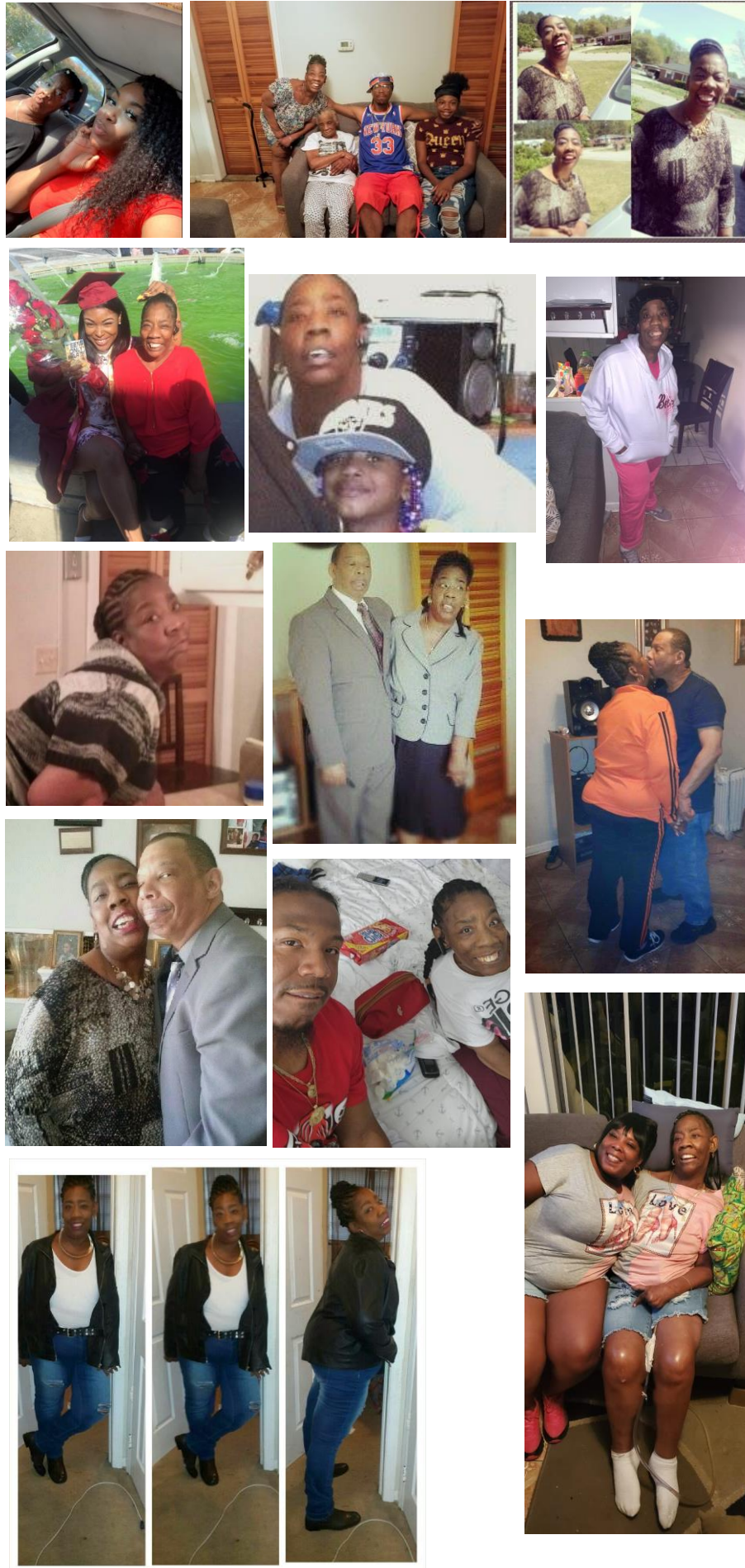
