

Obituary

Dr. Joe Eldon Kelly was born February 18, 1939, as the eighth child of Jessie Bell (Durham) Kelly and Mood Kelly, Sr., in Blythewood, SC. He departed this life after a brief illness on February 1, 2023. He was predeceased by his parents; his brothers, Clark, Mood Jr., Dolphas, and Harvey; his sisters, Ollie Armstrong, Kathleen Phillips, and Esther Williams; and his niece, Jeannette Jones, whom he regarded like a sister. At an early age, he joined Round Top Baptist Church, and later became a Deacon under Reverend Jerry M. Hollis.

He was educated in the public school system of Richland County School District Two, graduating from Bethel High School. He obtained his Bachelor's Degree in Science from Benedict College. He also earned his Master's Degree in Education from Duke University. Later, he completed his Doctorate in Education from South Carolina State University.

Joe worked in education all of his life. He started as a science teacher in Richland County School District Two, and would rise in administration to Assistant Principal at Spring Valley High School. He later worked in Adult Education in Richland County School District Two.

Joe retired from the South Carolina Education System after 32 years of service. Even after retirement, his calling remained helping to educate the next generation. He moved to Georgia and continued teaching in the Georgia public system for another 20 years.

Joe remained involved in several civic and community associations. He was a lifelong NEA, SCASA, and NAACP member. His passion was to see young people, especially African Americans, reach their maximum potential in education.
