## Obituary

Fannie Belle Harp Carson was born May 4, 1930, in Saluda County, South Carolina. A twin, she, and Annie Belle, were born to the late Will and Sarah Harp. She was one of a total of 14 siblings. Ambitious and industrious, she attended church and public school in Saluda County, at a time when her parents had to pay for her education. Hers was the first class required by the state to matriculate through 12<sup>th</sup> grade to get a high school diploma.

Fannie attended Allen University, where she majored in elementary education, played basketball, and worked to send herself to school. While at Allen, she boarded with Mr. and Mrs. L.W. Dakers, who quickly became her second family. Helping to entertain servicemen at the USO near Allen's campus, she met the love of her life, Second Lieutenant William H. Carson. Upon completion of his active-duty service requirement, they were married on February 19, 1955.

Shortly after graduation in 1953, Fannie was offered her first career job, teaching 8th grade in Ridge Spring, SC. After marriage, she and William moved to Columbia, where both secured nearby teaching positions. The marriage was blessed with the births of two children-- Winifred Yvonne Carson-Smith (Frank), a lawyer, and William Harvey Carson, Jr., a physician. Fannie poured her being into this family, which she cherished, creating a home built on Faith and Love. With family as their number one priority, Fannie and Bill generously aided their extended families. In addition to educating her children, Fannie welcomed into her home two of her nieces, the late Jonell Coleman Hopkins, and Barbara Jean Coleman Butler, both of whom she sent to college. She and her husband also supported the educational endeavors of numerous other family members.

A woman of spirit and action, Fannie accomplished much during her ninety-two years. From Ridge Spring, she moved to Richland District One, teaching at Gadsden Elementary. With the integration of South Carolina schools, she was assigned to A.C. Moore Elementary, where she remained until her retirement in 1986. She returned to graduate school, earning a master's in education from South Carolina State College. With an infectious smile and a big hug, Fannie opened her heart to her young charges, whom she proudly mentored and supported for the rest of their lives. She followed their exploits, taking pride in their accomplishments and staying in touch. Lucky were the children who ended up with Mrs. Carson as their teacher!

An ardent churchwoman, Fannie joined Pine Pleasant C.M.E as a child. She was a member of Bethel A.M.E. from young adulthood to middle age and in her later years, she joined Francis Burns United Methodist Church. She served as Sunday School teacher, Bible School teacher, Couples' Ministry leader (with her husband) and member of the Pulpit Aid Society and the Senior Ministry. Like her mother, sisters, and brothers, she was a lifelong member of the Women's Home Aid Society, a mutual benefit organization established in the 1800's. Fannie was also an active member of the Allen University Alumni Association, Richland District One Teachers and Retired Teachers Organizations, the SC Education Association, and Avante Garde.

Fannie is predeceased by her parents; her brothers and their spouses: Charlie (Mattie Bess), Wilson, Sr. (Gladys), Willie (Alberta), Grady (Sarah), Eugene (Willie) and Ceasar (Fannie) Harp; and, her sisters and their spouses: Annie Belle Harp, Eliza Mae Harp, Sarah Caldwell (Joseph) and Emma H. Coleman (Gary)and her nieces who lived with her, loved and cared for her Barbara Jean Butler, Jonell Hopkins (William Earl) and Geraldine Morgan (James).

In addition to her children, she leaves to mourn her passing her devoted brother and sister-in-law, Johnnie and Bennie Harp, nieces and nephews, Susie Harp, Charlie Harp (Beverly), Greta Gallman (Charles), George Coleman (Phyllis), Louis Coleman (Patricia), Malcolm Harp, Wilson Harp (Alice), Blanche Elizabeth Davenport, Jerry Caldwell (Judy), Joseph Caldwell Frankie Caldwell (Angela) Reginald Harp (LaShawn and Gwendolyn Harp.
