Mr. Leonard Green, Jr., 88, of Columbia, South Carolina, was born on October 2, 1934, to the late Leonard Green Sr. and Nancy Green. He passed into peaceful rest on Monday, February 28, 2023. "Duck," as he was affectionately known, by his siblings because of his passion for swimming, graduated from C.A. Johnson High School (the home of the Mighty Green Hornets) in 1953, where he excelled academically, was recognized for his contributions as an outstanding planner, and was even a bit of a football star. After attending Johnson C. Smith University on scholarship for several years, he joined the United States Air Force. He embodied their core values of "integrity first, service before self, and excellence in all we do" achieving the rank of Senior Master Sergeant serving his country proudly.

Leonard excelled throughout his Air Force career, working as Aeromedical Services Technician. He was often recognized for his dedication to duty, broad job knowledge, integrity, bearing and exemplary leadership. In addition to providing undisputed expertise in administrative management to Surgeon staff, he deployed to various destinations as part of Medical Evacuation Teams at times working in the outskirts of the base and beyond, doing helicopter rescue performing traumatic emergency medical care for injured service members in hostile environments. Amongst his many distinguished professional accomplishments, he also earned the Vietnam Service Medal. His professional success contributing to the Air Force medical mission is a testament to his genuine care for others and commitment to the defense of our nation. After his military service, he went on to enjoy an engaging experience with the United States Postal Service, as a letter carrier.

He was a faithful Christian, who accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior fulfilling duties as a Deacon at North Columbia Baptist Church. He shared the love of Christ in his steadfast and sincere manner with anyone who would listen. Although a man of few words at times, he exuded an assured confidence and love towards others, seeking each day to be more like Jesus. His kind spirit and genuine words of encouragement had a way of piercing through life's day to day concerns putting things in their proper perspective.

Mr. Green was preceded in death by his two daughters, Lola R. Brown and Jeannelle Leona Green. He leaves to cherish his memory: his loving, dedicated, and loyal wife of 52 years, Yasuko T. Green; his son, Leo Y. Green (Mariko); his brother, Bobbing W. Green (Bertha), of El Paso, TX; four sisters of Columbia, SC, Janie Walters (Marion), Sallie Wood (Grover), Fristella Branch, and Ella D. Bookert. Leonard lived an amazing and blessed life under God's guidance and direction. He was an inspiration, and his presence will be missed by all his loved ones who have peace knowing that he is resting in the arms of his Savior.
