

In Memoriam

ergeant Peter "Pete" Williams honorably served his country in the U.S. Army during the Vietnam War as a member of Alpha Company 2nd Battalion 16th Infantry, 1st Armored Division. In 1967, Sergeant Williams entered the military and served as a 11B Infantryman while deployed to Vietnam.

ergeant Williams served with incredible distinction during his time in the service and was awarded the following decorations: the Bronze Star for heroic achievement, Combat Infantryman Badge, Marksman Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, and finally, the Vietnam Service Medal with two Bronze Service Stars. Servant Williams was discharged with full honors in 1973.



Non-Commissioned Officer Creed

No one was more professional than Pete. He was a noncommissioned officer, a leader of soldiers. As a non commissioned officer, he conducted himself so as to bring great credit upon the corp, the military service, and his country, regardless of the situation in which he found himself.

Competence was his watchword. His two basic responsibilities were always uppermost in his mind; accomplishment of his mission and the welfare of his soldiers.

Pete strived to remain technically and tactically proficient. He exercised initiative by taking appropriate action in the absent of orders. He never forgot nor did he allow his comrades to forget that they were professionals, non commissioned officers, leaders.

After honorably serving our country, Sergeant Williams spent the majority of his civilian career as a Cement Pipe Finisher with AMERICAN SpiralWeld Pipe. He retired in 2008 after many years with the company.



Your life was a blessing and your memory a treasure. You are loved beyond words and missed beyond measure.



(My Honey didn't eat leftover biscuits or cornbread)


I'll miss you tomorrow
