Obituary of MSG (Ret) William Hayes

MSG (Ret) William Hayes was born on January 27, 1939, in Water Valley, Mississippi. He was the youngest child of the late Mary Hayes. He departed from this earth on Tuesday, April 11, 2023.

Mr. Hayes was educated in the public schools of Mississippi, and later graduated from the public schools of Chicago, IL. He received an Associate's Degree in Public Service and Criminal Justice from Midlands Technical College. Additionally, he graduated from Morris College, with a degree in Theological Studies to become a licensed Reverend. He enlisted in the United States Army, and retired after 27 years of service in 1991. Once retired from the United States Army, he worked for the South Carolina Department of Corrections and retired after 22 years as an Associate Warden at Trenton Correctional Institution.

During his military service, he realized his ability to reach the youth and troubled adults. It was a privilege to be able to touch their lives in a way that would drive them to be self sufficient, productive individuals. Because of this, he heard a special calling on his life, far beyond his military service and duties with the Department of Corrections. He answered the call to minister in 2006. After being installed as a minister, he began to spread the word and provide weekly bible study to the residents at Carolina Homes Senior Center. He also served as an Associate Minister at First Nazareth Baptist Church.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 57 years, Alberta P. Hayes; sister, Mary Katherine Allen; and brother, Ollie Judson.


