JéQuetta Carolyn Lucille Mallette Snell, affectionately known as “JJ”, “Quetta”, “Ma” and “Granny” was born November 22, 1956 on a beautiful, crisp Thanksgiving Day in Kinston, North Carolina; in her grandparents’ house! She was born to the late Lieutenant Colonel Herbert Mallette, Army, Ret. and Mrs. Carolyn Stewart Mallette.

She enjoyed traveling the United States with her parents and even traveled throughout Europe where she learned to speak German and French fluently.

Upon returning to the States, JéQuetta attended Lady of Atonement Catholic School in North Carolina. There the Godly principles and family values instilled in her were reinforced as Education AND Faith were intertwined. She often laughed about having to go to the “cloak room.” At a very early age she learned how to practice implying her faith to real world situations. Something that carried over into her adult life.
