Mrs. Precolla Fritzell Thomas Bell was born on April 16, 1967, to Billy James and Betty Switzler Thomas, in Columbia, SC. PreColla was the second oldest of three beautiful children. She grew up in the Hollywood Hills and Newcastle Subdivisions.

Precolla attended John P. Thomas Elementary, Alcorn Middle, and graduated from Eau Claire High School in 1985. While attending Eau Claire High School, she participated in several school activities. She was on the track and field team, basketball team, and a member of JROTC. She participated in these activities throughout her duration of high school. Precolla also attended Midlands Technical College, in Columbia, SC, studying Business Administration, while mastering her secretarial skills.

On September 26, 1999, PreColla Thomas married James Bell, in Columbia, SC at Community Covenant Church. They lived in Northeast Columbia.

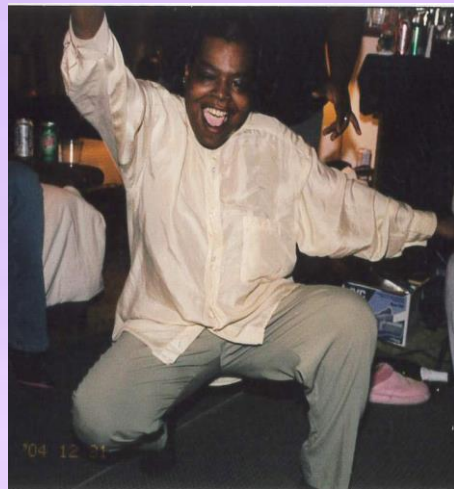
