

## To Those I Love and To Those Who Love Me

SFC (Ret) William Alfred Davis was born on April 29, 1934, in Kinston (Lincoln City), North Carolina. He was the sixth child born to the late Virginia Dillabunt and Arthur R. Davis, Sr. William departed this earthly life on Thursday, May 25, 2023, after 89 wonderful years of life.

He was educated in the public schools of Lenoir County, North Carolina. William was a graduate of Adkin High School, where he took part in a student led walk-out to protest racial disparities during that time. He loved the sport of boxing and was known around the community as "the boxer;" in fact, he would walk around with two pairs of boxing gloves, one for him and one for any challenger. His boxing team integrated Grainger Stadium, where they were invited for a competition.

William received Christ at an early age and became a member of St. Peter's Church. In his later years, he visited many churches and held bible study in his home.

After graduation, William enlisted in the United States Army. Shortly thereafter, William met and married Catherine Breeland. They enjoyed 63 years of marriage before God called her home. William retired, after 23 years of service.

After retiring, he furthered his education at Midlands Technical College, where he earned certificates in Brick Masonry, Carpentry, and Welding. William went on to work for the V.A. Hospital, where he retired for a second time.

William was a strong and quiet man, who left a positive impression on everyone who knew him. He was dedicated to his family and always set the example.
